PARENT TEACHER MEETING



Class X gave the school 100% results with 37 students scoring above 80%, while Class XII scored 85% passing percentage. Top achievers were: Tejaswini Jagtap, Riya Tekade, Samruddhi Deshmukh & Rutveek Deshmukh with 10 CGPA in class X while Yuvraj Borkhade topped in class XII with 90%.

CCE

Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation – A system familiar to all schools affiliated to CBSE, is implemented in classes I to X. The assessment covers not only scholastic but co-scholastic aspects that cater to the progress and development of students. The system requires assessment of academic areas in the form of formative and summative assessment.

Term-1 comprises of FA-1+FA-2+SA-1 while Term-2 has FA-3+FA-4+SA-2.

Within this system the need of a Counsellor in the institution is a must. The school therefore arranged for the visit of a Counsellor Dr. Mohana Kulkarni, whose expertise ability helps towards issues relating to adolescence, academics growth and other behavioural problems.
