Topic - Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam

Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam (Avul Pakir Jainulabdeen Abdul Kalam) was born on 15th October 1931 in the temple town of Rameswaram, located in Tamil Nadu. Due to poverty, Dr. Abdul Kalam had to sell newspapers in his early childhood to run his family, but he was a hardworking and sharp student. He started his schooling from Schwartz Higher School in Ramanathapuram. He then moved on to complete his graduation in physics from the University of Madras and after that to study aerospace technology from the Madras Institute of Technology, Dr. Kalam started his career as a scientist from the Aeronautical Development Establishment of DRDO and worked under the eminent scientist Vikram Sarabhai. He started his contribution as a scientist in 1969 when he was the project director of India's first satellite Launch Vehicle (SLV-III). He is considered the developer of the Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle. He is also played a crucial role in the development of Agni and Prithvi missiles. Dr. Kalam was the Chief Scientific Adviser to the Prime Minister in 1992 when the Polahran-II nuclear tests were conducted. In 2002, Dr. Kalam was elected as the 11th President of India. He had received the title of 'People's President.' During his tenure as President, He was only the third President to be awarded the Bharat Ratna. He also imposed President's rule in Bihar in 2005. However, he did not file for Presidency for a second term and instead returned to the field of academics and continued to do so till his death in 2015.

Day 2 (Brahmacharini): On the second day, devotees worship Brahmacharini. It is believed that in this avatar, Goddess Parvati please Lord Shiva by meditation. This day brings purity and peace.

Day 3: (Chandraghanta): This day is observed to worship Goddess Chandraghanta. In this avatar, Goddess wears a crescent moon on her forehead and with eight arms she pledges to destroy evils. This day brings passion and love in

Day 4 (Kushmanda): The fourth day of Sharad Navratri has its own significance. On this day Devi Kushmanda- Goddess of creation is worshipped. This day brings elegance and panache in our lives.

Day 5 (Skandamata): On the fifth day (Panchami) of the Sharad Navratri, Goddess Skandamata (seated on a lotus) is worshipped. She carries two lots in her hands and little Kartikay on her lap. This avatar of Goddess Durga brings prosperity and

Day 6 (Katyayani): On this day, Goddess Parvati takes the avatar of a warrior and shows her one of the most violent forms. This day also brings fertility and symbolises

Day 7 (Kalaratri): The seventh day (Saptami) of the Sharad Navratri is dedicated to Goddess Kalratri. She is worshipped for her immense sacrifice and wars against demons. On this day, people are advised to wear grey clothes.

Day 8 (Mahagauri): Durga Ashtami (eighth day of Navratri) is of Goddess Mahagauri. On this day, Devi Parvati rides on a white elephant and holds Trishul and Damru. This avatar brings opulence and richness among devotees.

Day 9 (Sidhidatri): On the ninth-day of Sharad Navratri Goddess Siddhiratri is worshipped. Goddess Siddhiratri holds books in her hand which symbolises the importance of education. This day brings compassion and dedication.


